

Online campsite reservation changes – October 13, 2009

The following campgrounds are now closed for the season:

- Bow Valley Provincial Park – Bow Valley campground
- Cypress Hills Provincial Park - Ferguson Hill campground
- Cypress Hills Provincial Park - Firerock campground
- Cypress Hills Provincial Park - Lodgepole campground
- Cypress Hills Provincial Park – Old Baldy campground
- Lesser Slave Lake Provincial Park – Marten River campground
- Peter Lougheed Provincial Park - Boulton Creek campground
- Tillebrook Provincial Park

- Long Lake Provincial Park (loops A, C & E open until first snowfall)
- McLean Creek Provincial Recreation Area (campground open year-round)
- Miquelon Lake Provincial Park (loop A open year-round)
- Moose Lake Provincial Park (campground open until first snowfall)
- Saskatoon Island Provincial Park (campground open until first snowfall)
- William A. Switzer Provincial Park (Gregg Lake campground open year-round)
- Writing-on-Stone Provincial Park (campground open year-round)
- Young's Point Provincial Park (campground open until first snowfall)

Cypress Hills Provincial Park – Elkwater campground:

- Campsites in loop C close Dec. 1/09
- Campsites in loops A & B open year-round

Cypress Hills Provincial Park - Lakeview campground:

- Campground closes for the season Dec. 1/09

Jarvis Bay Provincial Park:

- Campground closes for the season Oct. 19/09

Pembina River Provincial Park:

- Campground closes for the season Oct. 31/09
